INTRODUCTION & BACKGROUND



- The South African Police Service is mandated by Section 205 of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa 1996 (ACT 108 and 1996) to prevent, combat, and investigate crime, to maintain public order, to protect and secure the inhabitants of the Republic and their property and to uphold and enforce the law.
- ☐ The Government has through the JCPS Cluster reaffirmed its commitment to achieving the outputs of the Delivery Agreement which deals with Outcome 3: "All People in South Africa are and feel safe" by going beyond the call of duty in safeguarding the society in fighting crime.



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GENERAL CHALLENGES CHARACTERISED BY LEVELS OF VIOLENCE

- □ South Africa currently is continuously experiencing increased levels of lawlessness, intolerance and disregard for the rule of law and more than often with impunity.
- ☐ The manifestation is evident in the following:
 - Community protests;
 - Industrial actions,
 - Land invasions,
 - Defacing of statues
 - Violence against Foreign Nationals,
 - Road and traffic violations,
 - taxi violence
 - Incidents of incitements through social media and other platforms without serious repercussions
 - Damage to and theft of trucks (SA vs foreign truck drivers)
 - Damage to road and rail infrastructure and trains



- ☐ The above structures have been established at all levels and are always activated as command structures during all multidisciplinary operations.
- ☐ All operational successes are reported to the NATJOC for consolidation and reporting to relevant structures.



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MULTI-DISCIPLINARY APPROACH



- ☐ The South African Police Service in Partnership with other Government Departments and other role players through the JCPS cluster, embarks on regular Multi-disciplinary Operations to combat crime.
- □ Road Policing and crime combatting initiatives are undertaken with various role players to combat lawlessness and to ensure compliance with the laws of the country.
- Multi-disciplinary Road Policing initiatives are performed during Easter and Festive Season Holidays to ensure safety of all road users.

MULTI-DISCIPLINARY APPROACH

The following Multi-disciplinary operations are conducted on a regular basis:

- Community Policing Forum(CPF) crime prevention initiatives
- Rhino Poaching Operations
- 16 days of Activism no Violence against women and children
- Anti drug campaigns and operations
- Cross border operations
- Road Policing which includes high visibility patrols, VCPs & roadblocks
- ☐ Various Task Teams have been established to deal with lawlessness and investigation of prevalent serious crime:
 - Taxi Task Teams
 - Sexual Offences Task Teams
 - Vehicle Theft Unit
 - Cross border crime investigations
 - Crowd control Units

 - Well planned crime combatting initiatives:
 - Effective Communication with all stakeholders
 - Integration of systems with departments

 - Establishment of Highway Patrol and Motorbike Units
