PART ONE: CONSTITUTIONAL COURT JUDGMENT

CONCOURT JUDGMENT AND ITS IMPLICATIONS

The Constitutional Court on 12 July 2023 declared the establishment of the Administrative Adjudication of Road Traffic Offences Act, 46 of 1998 and Amendment Act of 2019 through national legislation to be valid and constitutional, thereby setting aside the previous High Court judgment of 13 January 2022.

This, therefore, means that AARTO will be implemented nationally upon proclamation and replace the issuing of traffic fines through the Criminal Procedure Act. The Constitutional Court further ruled that the introduction of Electronic Service through the Amendment Act was constitutional.

The favourable judgment has the following effects:

- The rollout of AARTO nationally;
- Road traffic offences will be dealt with administratively instead of overburdening the Criminal Courts with these kinds of matters;
- Introduction of the demerits points in which drivers will be allocated points for offences and face suspension or cancellation of their driving licences;
- Engagement with the SAPO and the Department of Communications and Digital Technologies;



CONCOURT JUDGMENT AND ITS IMPLICATIONS (Cont.)

- The proclamation of the AARTO Act preceded by all the institutional arrangements are in place.
- Finalisation of the Appeals Tribunal
- Finalisation of the concurrence from the MEC of the Western Cape Mobility Department;
- Revival of the refresher training for the traffic law enforcement officers, back-office users and cashiers on AARTO;
- Install all outstanding user equipment and network connectivity to NaTIS
- Ensure that all Issuing Authorities enter into commercial agreements with SAPO for postage and GPW for notice booklets;
- Resuscitation of the education and awareness campaigns;
- Finalisation of the appointment within the RTIA in the light of the Constitutional Court judgment;
- Assessment of the readiness status of the IAs, and implement the gap analysis action plan;

To implement the roll-out in 144 municipal areas including Adjudication Process, Electronic Service and Appeals Tribunal

PHASE 4



01 SEPTEMBER 2024

Go-live with PDS and Rehabilitation Programme .



PROGRAMME PARTNERS

The RTIA depends on both the implementing partners and mandatory processes for the success of the roll-out. The following are the programme dependencies that are mandatory, as they are contractually or legally required as part of the national roll-out.

- The RTMC: To provide an efficient NCR system that can withstand the additional workload of IAs
- The SAPO: To provide electronic postage and service of documents to all municipalities as per the ECTA of 2002
- **Issuing Authorities:** To meet the minimum requirements as prescribed and execute the AARTO processes.
- WC MEC: To concur with the Minister of Transport on AARTO
- National Treasury: To ensure that the Agency has the capabilities and resources to implement a successful roll-out
- The GPW: To provide the necessary infringement notice booklets;
- The DOT: To facilitate the publication of regulations and the proclamation of the Act;

PART FOUR: READINESS ASSESSMENT STATUS UPDATE

READINESS ASSESSMENT

The RTIA has conducted AARTO readiness assessments in all the provinces, districts, and local municipalities throughout the country during the 2021/22 financial year. The assessments were conducted based on the following five (5) key areas as minimum requirements:

- 1. Training of officials (law enforcement, back office and cashiers)
- 2. Installation of IT equipment
- 3. NaTIS network connectivity
- 4. Contracting of municipalities and provinces with SAPO for posting notices
- 5. Contracting of municipalities and provinces with GPW for procurement of AARTO stationery
- As a result, a gap analysis action plan was generated, which will address all the above areas prior to roll-out

LEGISLATIVE TRAINING WORKSHOPS

PURPOSE

- Entrench the understanding of the key tenets of the AARTO Act with the key stakeholders.
- Stimulate the dialogue on the AARTO Act with the key stakeholders.
- Translation of the AARTO Act in the different languages.
- Establishment of learning forums at the Associations which represent the key stakeholders.
- Establishment of focus groups within the key stakeholders as a platform to demonstrate the workings of AARTO Act.



LEGISLATIVE TRAINING WORKSHOPS

Methods of Delivering the Programme

- Through workshops in different provinces.
- On going learning forums.
- On going perceptions surveys.
- Continuous Q & A / FAQ's which the agency uses to generate responses and also as a mechanism for on going education and entrenchment.
